An above average June was followed  
by a very dry July. Only 45mm of rain  
was recorded, well under the average  
of 189.5 and setting a new record. Only  
8 days of rain were recorded with the  
heaviest fall of 18mm occurring on the  
final day of July.

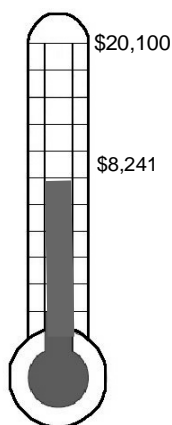
Total rainfall for the year to date is  
404.8mm.

The driest year previously was 76.3mm  
in 1959. Wettest July on record was in  
1958 when 423.4mm was recorded.

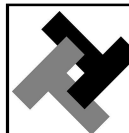

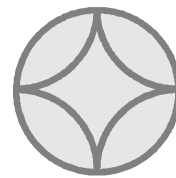
After the AGM, members received a presentation from Melva Mitchell from

## WVC NEWS AUGUST: THE CAT ACT

In November this year the first phase of the introduction of the state's new cat laws will come into effect. The laws will require compulsory sterilisation, microchipping and registration of cats with the local council by the time they are 6 months of age. Cat owners will be required from November 2013 to fully comply with the new legislation.

The majority of cat owners are responsible however the aim of the Act is to reduce the number of stray (unowned) cats that cause nuisance, damage to property and native wildlife. The Act will enforce some level of responsible pet ownership by people that own cats or look after a cat in some way (semi-own) through limiting unwanted breeding (through sterilisation) and permanent identification of cats (through microchipping). However the success of the legislation on unwanted cat numbers will be dependent on the level of enforcement by local governments. All other states in Australia have some form on cat legislation requiring compulsory registration, microchipping or sterilisation, the success of which is debatable.

The Act allows for cats found in a public place or on private property to be seized and then rehomed or disposed of if unidentifiable or unclaimed. While it may not stop irresponsible people from letting their unsterilised cats breed and roam, it will make local governments take responsibility for the problem. At the moment the cost of dealing with stray animals is often borne by rescue groups such as the Cat Haven, private individuals or people in the veterinary industry.

If there are stray cats that are causing a nuisance they can be dealt with by local government if they are able to be caught. After they are subsequently seized if they are claimed within 7 days by someone then they will be required to comply with the Act or face fines.

The cost of sterilisation and microchipping are a one off cost in the lifetime of the cat (15-20 years in many cases). Price varies depending on the safety and quality of the surgery provided however the costs would still be expected to be less than approximately \$200 - 250 total for both sterilisation and microchipping, with many vets offering a discount for aged pensioners. Microchipping can be done at any time but can also be done at the same time as sterilisation. Most sterilisation procedures are done at a loss by veterinary clinics as they are a heavily discounted surgery (often with cats total surgery costing less than an anaesthetic alone) so it is not something that the industry makes a lot of money from despite the public perception.

The price of registration has not been made available at present by most local governments but the discussion paper preceding the Act proposed it to be less than or on par with dog registration. The state government did announce there would be subsidies available for sterilisation and microchipping for people on low incomes; however no further information is available at this time.

There are some exemptions from the Act. Cat breeders will be exempt from complying with the Act. An individual must apply to local government for an approval to breed cats. An exemption can also be given when a veterinarian certifies that sterilisation or microchipping may adversely affect the health and welfare of the cat. This would most commonly be applicable to senior cats that may not do well under anaesthesia or cats that have a condition that meant that implanting a microchip between their shoulder blades would cause harm. However such certificates cannot apply to cats under 6 months of age.

Local government will be responsible for the administration of the Act. Local governments will be responsible for managing the registration process including the maintenance of relevant databases. In addition, local governments will be expected to seize and impound unregistered or unidentified cats. Registration and impounding fees will offset these costs.

In line with relevant laws and legislation stray animals (dogs and soon cats) can only be taken in by local governments and their authorised agents. Waroona Veterinary Clinic is not authorised to take stray animals by the shire, so please contact the shire when you have found a stray animal (including animals after hours) as legally there is nothing we can do.

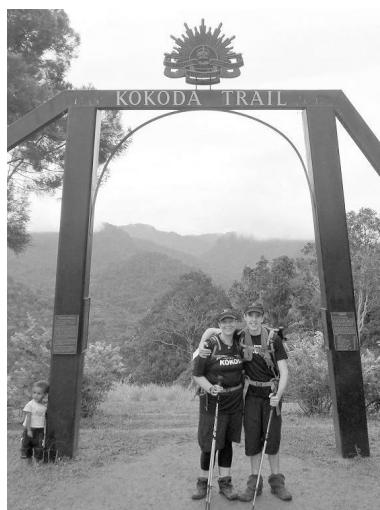

## WALKING THE KOKODA TRAIL A MOVING EXPERIENCE

Annette Wilson and her son Robert Horn recently completed the 95 km Kokoda Track. The trek began in Kokoda Village and over the next 7 days followed the route of the fighting withdrawal carried out by the Australian Soldiers in WWII. This withdrawal was carried out under heavy fire, facing an enemy that outnumbered them 6 to 1.

With four months of hard training behind them nothing could have prepared Annette and Rob for the punishing terrain that faced them. While this trek in peace time didn't include being under enemy fire,

mountainous conditions, slippery ascents and descents and river crossings.

Meeting the local people along the way was wonderful – despite living in extreme poverty they were proud, modest, so friendly and welcoming. The local porters were absolutely fantastic and the organisation of the trekking company Executive Excellence and specifically Trek Leader Al Forsyth, made for a trouble free, memorable experience.

*We are now back in Australia - currently in Brisbane airport waiting for our flight this afternoon to Perth. What a trip!!! How best to describe this experience; punishing, heartbreaking, terrifying, exhilarating, emotional, incredible, absolutely mind-blowing!!! So proud we completed it together.*

## NOTHING CUTE ABOUT KITTEN AND PUPPY SCAMS

Don't let kitten scammers get their claws into your money.

It's a new version of the age-old puppy scam.

Scammers advertise a puppy or kitten for sale in the classifieds either in newspapers or online, usually providing an email address as a contact point. The animal being advertised is often a popular breed and the asking price is lower than the market value. The scammers come up with various explanations as to why they are selling the puppy or kitten; often a tragic story such which requires a fast sale, such as the owner having died or being too ill to look after the animals.

If the advert is online, they're usually selling via legitimate trading websites and the offer of sale will show up when you search for puppies or kittens for sale in your local area e.g. Albany/Bunbury/Broome/Geraldton/Kalgoorlie. But then when you make contact with the advertiser they turn out to have the animal over in the Eastern states (of course it doesn't really exist at all).

The seller requests that payment for a crate and shipping of the kitten or puppy be sent by wire transfer. Sadly the animal never arrives and Consumer Protection has received reports of monetary loss from many heartbroken would-be pet owners. In one case, a regional consumer wired \$500 but no dog arrived. He was then told there had been a shipping problem and was asked to send a further \$100. When he still didn't

receive his puppy, he asked a friend to pretend to be a buyer and contact the seller. His friend was told the puppy was still available.

Another consumer was fooled into believing she was dealing with someone living in WA and was asked to send the money to a wire transfer agency which she believed to be in a local town. However the scammer was actually located in Africa and the money was picked up in Cameroon.

Be cautious of purchasing goods sight unseen from strangers; especially if they request money be sent via wire transfer.

Resist pressure to act now. If you have any doubts, don't go ahead with the deal and contact Consumer Protection's dedicated scam investigation section – WA ScamNet – for advice. Remember there are legitimate sellers who advertise puppies for sale on websites but you should seek to independently verify their identity.

Don't forget there are local animal welfare places where you can adopt a pet.

### ABOUT OUR DAMS

Our oldest dam, of earthfill construction, is Drakes Brook Dam constructed in 1931. Drakes Brook has a storage capacity of 2,290 ML. It has a catchment area of 5,900 hectares and a surface area of 417 hectares.

Its present storage is 1,870 ML (81.66%).

Samson Brook Dam, also of earthfill construction, was built in 1941. It has a catchment area of 6,500 hectares and a surface area of 97 hectares. It has been supplying water to Perth through the IWSS since 2001. It has a capacity of almost 8 million kilolitres. No storage data is available for Sampson Brook Dam.

A pipehead dam was constructed in 2002 west of the main dam. This

has the capability of supplying 12 GL of water to Perth.

Waroona Dam is an earthfill construction which was built in 1966. It has a catchment area of 4,700 hectares and a surface area of 1,440 hectares. The wall height is 36 metres above ground level and its length is 381 metres.

The storage capacity of Waroona Dam is 15,173 ML. The highest recorded storage of 14,644 ML was reached on 28 November 2005. The lowest level of 419 ML was recorded in May 2002 when the dam was undergoing extensive reconstruction.

Present storage is 3,237 ML (21.33%).

## WAROONA MURDERS

A murder of about a quarter of a century ago\* which caused a great sensation at the time, is recalled by the death at Pinjarra of Miss Martha Fouracre, the sister of the victim, Miss Leah Fouracre.

The late Miss Fouracre was born in what is now known as the Waroona district. and lived her long life of over 70 years at the family homestead, 'Drakes-brook.' the name the district bore before being called Waroona. Her parents were among the earliest settlers of the Shire, and the family is well known around Pinjarra and the neighbouring districts. The Lake Clifton murder, as it was called, occurred about 1907, when the late Miss Fouracre's sister Leah, who was living alone in a little house near Lake Clifton, was killed by a Cingalese, who burnt down the house to destroy evidence of the crime and fled from the district. Rumour had it that there was a hoard of money kept by the woman, and it was presumed that the Cingalese, who was a wanderer who

had partaken of her hospitality for a few days, had come to hear about it and had decided to murder his benefactress. His liberty after his crime was short-lived, for within a few days he was captured near Bunbury and later he was hanged.

### Another Murder

In 1919, 29 year old Otto Bismark Haub was shot and killed by Robert Phal (56). There had been an on-going dispute between the two men about shooting ducks on Preston Lake. Haub used to fire into the air to scare the ducks away if he knew Phal was hunting and this eventually boiled over into an argument and Phal shot Haub in the chest.

Phal fled the district but was arrested in Perth but at his trial he was found 'not guilty' on the grounds of insanity. He was held at 'His Majesty's Pleasure' for 10 years before he was released.

Cold sores (*herpes labialis*) are small blisters that usually form on the lips or skin around the mouth, nose and on the chin. They are caused by infection with the herpes simplex virus (HSV). People are usually infected in childhood or young adulthood, and the infection persists for life.

### Herpes simplex infection is very common

Around 90 per cent of adults have herpes simplex antibodies in their bloodstream, which means that they have been infected with the virus at some time. However, the first (or primary) infection does not usually cause any symptoms.

One-third of infected people experience cold sores, which are a recurrence of the earlier infection and do not indicate recent infection. Most of these people would not have experienced symptoms from the first infection.

### Triggers

In some people the HSV infection causes cold sores, which erupt following a trigger event such as a cold. This explains the term 'cold sore'. Other triggers that may cause an attack of cold sores include:

- Feverish illnesses, like influenza, or chest infections
- Sunlight
- Exposure to windy conditions
- Hormonal changes, such as the menstrual period
- Emotional or physical stress.

## COLD SORES

It is important to remember that cold sores are a symptom of ongoing infection rather than primary infection. The sores usually recur in the same place.

### Cold sore symptoms

Cold sores usually develop as follows:

- Localised itching and tingling a day or two before the cold sore appears.
- A collection of small blisters forms which may be painful, tender with a hot, burning sensation. The blisters burst after a few days.
- The site develops a crust.
- The crust dries up and eventually falls off after about 10 days.

### Complications

Cold sores are an annoying problem for most people, but they get better without any specific treatment. However, in people with some types of immunosuppression, the cold sores can spread more widely and the symptoms can be more severe. Medication may be required in these cases.

Uncommon complications that require medical attention include bacterial infections, with possible symptoms including redness around the blisters, pus in the blisters and fever.

Cold sores can also spread to the eyes, fingers or other parts of the body. A cold sore in the eye causes a painful, red eye. Immediate medical attention should be sought, as the

herpes virus causes an ulcer on the cornea that can damage sight. However, permanent damage can usually be prevented by early treatment, including medication to suppress the virus. There are other more common causes of a painful red eye, which also require medical review.

Treatment now available from your pharmacist for cold sores

Treatment does not cure the infection and is not necessary for most cases.

**Creams** to treat the symptoms can be soothing, as can ice on the blisters. Simple **painkillers** may occasionally be required. **Povidone-iodine ointments** (commonly known as Betadine) can be dabbed onto the cold sores and may reduce symptoms in some people. Other creams containing **local anaesthetic** can help reduce the pain and itching. **Hydrocolloid dressings** can be used to cover the lesions to help prevent secondary bacterial infections and help with the healing process.

**Antiviral medications** come in many forms, including creams and tablets. These shorten the duration of the cold sore by reducing the ability of the virus to reproduce and work best when used at the earliest stages of cold sore development, when the area is tingling. Tablets are now available as a single dose treatment from your pharmacist, however, not everyone experiences warning signs of an impending cold sore. Speak to your local pharmacist to see if this treatment may be suitable for you.

## 45 PER CENT OF LOCALITIES IN CANNING WILL NOT RECEIVE FIBRE-TO-THE-HOME

Canning MHR Don Randall says 45 per cent of localities in the federal electorate of Canning will not receive fibre-to-the-home (FTTH) under the NBN rollout and will instead get a wireless service.

Mr Randall said NBN Co originally promised towns with 1,000 'people' or more would receive fibre but now says only towns with 1,000 'premises' or more will receive FTTH. "Now that NBN Co has changed the goalposts, up to 400 towns in regional Australia will not be on the Government's list of places to receive fibre-to-the-home connections," he said.

"Based on that information, some of the Canning towns that will not receive fibre-to-the-home include West Coolup, Wagerup, Tuart Grove, Nanga Brook, Lake Preston and Hamel. These are just some of the 43 localities that will be on wireless."

While NBN Co claims speeds of the NBN will be 100 megabits per second, its fixed

wireless network will only deliver initial speeds of up to 12 megabits per second.

NBN wireless could well end up being the dearest method and Telstra may come along to provide wireless at a fraction of the cost. No wonder the ACCC refused to sign off on NBN Co wanting to put a block on Telstra promoting wireless - that was just blatant anti-competition and highlights the monopoly that is the NBN.

Mr Randall said people should also be aware that even if they are in an area earmarked to receive FTTH, many areas will utilise a mix of fibre and fixed wireless meaning some homes and businesses will only have internet access through a wireless service.

Areas included in the 'mixed service' list included Mandurah, Pinjarra and Waroona in the south of the electorate; and Byford, Jarrahdale, Mundijong and Serpentine in the northern end.

## RODEO.

Our fourteen Australian team members had a wonderful learning experience at the National High School Rodeo Finals from July 15 - 21 in Rock Springs, Wyoming, USA.

The standard of competition was extremely high over all events, which showed our Aussie competitors another level of competition to what they have here.

Parris Denning of Queensland competed in 5 events and gained 1<sup>st</sup> in the impromptu speech section of the Queen contest. Mat Turner from NSW competed in the Bareback and qualified for the top 20 final and placed 17<sup>th</sup> overall. He also won a full rodeo scholarship.
