## SEPTEMBER RAINFALL

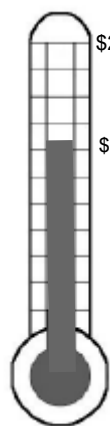

## OF FLEAS & FIREWORKS, SNAKES & SEEDS.

**Fleas:** With the warmer spring weather expect to see fleas become increasingly active. An individual adult flea can live from 4 to 28 days and produce 20 to 50 eggs every day. So in its lifetime **a single flea can produce up to 1400 offspring** to infest your home and threaten your pet's health and wellbeing. If you sight fleas or flea dirt (droppings from the flea which is partially digested blood from your pet) on your pet, then your pet needs treatment.

**So why are fleas a problem?** Apart from being incredibly annoying for your pet, fleas can also cause severe health problems. If your pet has fleas they are likely to have **Tapeworm** from ingesting the fleas as they groom. Pets that are severely affected by fleas can be anaemic due to blood loss. This is a big problem for smaller pets and for young animals such as kittens and puppies as their **anaemia** can become life threatening due to their small blood volume.

The most common problems of course are **skin problems**. Among other thing your pet can become hypersensitive (allergic) to the flea's saliva. Once this happens a single flea bite can set them off for days of itching. Signs of a flea problem can include constant scratching, hair loss (typically along the tail/spine), self-trauma (bleeding from scratching and biting themselves), a strong smell (caused by

skin infection), thickened skin, weeping skin or even hotspots. **If you think your pet is experiencing any of these problems, seek advice from your vet.**

**Waroona Show Fireworks:** Please be aware that the usual firework display at the Waroona Show can be terrifying for pets. It has been common nearly in all previous years for pets to go missing and even escape and get into accidents with motor vehicles. To prevent any potential disasters make sure you have your pet secured or in a well fenced area that they cannot jump out of. If possible keep your dogs and cats inside. If you are at home with your pets supervise them during the fireworks or keep checking on them until it is over.

**Snakes:** Snakes are out and about, so please be vigilant to any signs of sudden weakness in your pets and contact your vet.

**Grass Seeds:** This time of year it is very common for us to be removing grass seeds from all kinds of weird and wonderful places on your pets. Grass seeds can lodge in ears, nostrils, under the eyelids as well as penetrating skin (especially around the paws) as well as other "sensitive" areas. They are a problem for all dogs (and cats) but especially longer haired breeds. If your pet is routinely accessing areas with long grass it is a good idea to check your pet

over at least once per day (or straight after their walk) for seeds.

If grass seeds are not removed they can continue to burrow their way into your pet. If they penetrate under the skin the body reacts to the foreign material and an abscess usually results. Depending on where the grass seed penetrates (chest, abdomen) these infections can become life threatening if not treated. Areas to check for seeds are ears, between toes, armpits and eyes. Check your pet for swellings, lumps, discharge or signs of infection which can indicate the presence of a seed. It is a good idea in summer to clip your long haired pets, even is it just the feet and belly to reduce the chances of your pet picking up a seed.

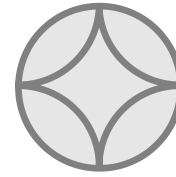
flagpoles at the Hall, Hamel Wetlands, which is an on-going project, the Drakesbrook Weir upgrade and the Golf Course being looked after by its members.

### **Lake Moyanup (Drakesbrook Weir).**

At present the business section in Waroona is struggling. There are lots of empty spaces and empty shops. The town needs to move forward. I think tourism can be further developed. Tourism means extra money in Waroona.

At the last Shire Council meeting I presented the council with several ideas to promote tourism for the town of Waroona.


I suggested that a hiking trail be established around Lake Moyanup. The west side of the lake already has a fine road, owned by the Water Corporation. The Water Corporation owns all land around the lake - 100 metres from the high water mark of Lake Moyanup – and does not oppose my idea.

I further suggested that Bonnie's bridge be used as the bridge on the trail to cross the small stream entering the lake. Bonnie's bridge can easily be dismantled into three parts, transported down the Water Corporation's road and then reassembled at a crossing point the people decide upon over the stream. The Water Corporation does not oppose that idea either.

I've contacted the owner of Bonnie's bridge. He will give the bridge to the Shire or any organisation wishing to use the bridge for a worthwhile purpose for nothing.

My third idea may be "a bridge too far" but I believe a caravan park could be set up and run by a private individual at Lake Moyanup. I'll explain how this can be done in the next issue of the paper.

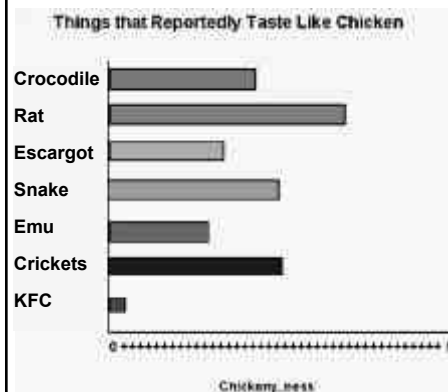

### Passport Photos

We are pleased to advise customers that the flash for our passport photo service has been replaced by Australia Post and we are now achieving much better results with the photos. However it is also important to note that Passport photos need to meet a stringent set of criteria per the application form otherwise they will be rejected by the passport office:

- The photo must be of your head and shoulders
- Show your shoulders square on
- Show your face square on (both face edges visible)
- Show you looking straight at the camera, and your head not tilted
- Be taken with a neutral expression (not laughing or frowning) with your mouth closed.
- Be close up, so that the head takes up between 32mm and 36mm of the photo
- Show your eyes open and clearly visible, and no hair in your eyes
- Show your eyes clearly through glasses, if you wear them, with no flash reflection off the glasses, no tinted lenses.
- Show you without any hat or other head covering (if you wear a head covering for religious reasons, we will accept a photo of you wearing it, but your facial features from bottom of chin to top of forehead and both edges of your face must be clearly shown).
- The photos must be no more than 6 months old
- The photos must be clear and of the appropriate size between 35mm and 40mm in width, and between 45mm and 50 mm in height,
- Be of good quality colour and on high quality paper, with no ink or marks on the image
- Have a plain, light coloured background

## POLICE REPORT

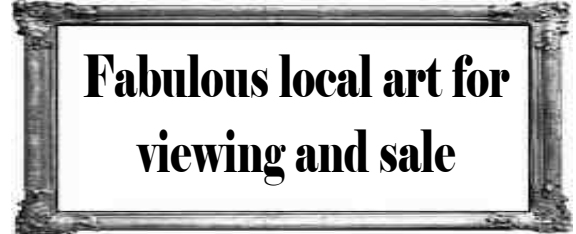

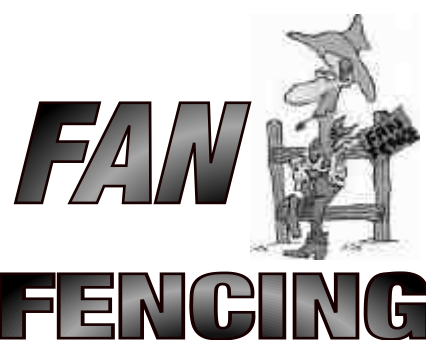

## DANGEROUS MAGNETS PULLED FROM MARKETPLACE TO KEEP KIDS SAFE

Small high powered magnets, which can kill or seriously injure if swallowed, are to be pulled from the Australian marketplace under a product safety ban put in place to protect children.

The little metal balls (4-5mm in diameter) are sold under various names including **BuckyBalls**, **Neocubes** and **Neodymium Sphere Magnets**. Although they are marketed at adults, they are attractive to children and if ingested the magnets can attach in the intestine, which usually requires emergency surgery and can lead to death.

Tragically, these small novelty magnets killed an 18 month old child in Queensland who swallowed 12 of them last year. More recently a three year old boy in Sydney underwent surgery for a perforated oesophagus after ingesting four of the magnets in May of this year. A seven year old boy and two 12 year old children in the Eastern states have also suffered serious injuries in the last few months.

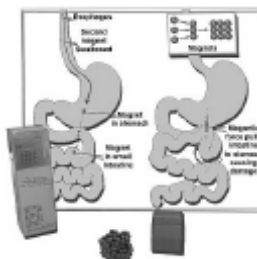

Here in WA, Princess Margaret Hospital reports there have been 33 cases of children swallowing magnets since 2006 and four were admitted to hospital for treatment. In April 2012, a two year old boy underwent emergency surgery to remove 27 small magnets from his stomach.

These novelty magnets have been on sale in WA for some time and we would urge any parent or guardian to ensure that toys or novelty items containing magnets are kept out of reach of young children. If a child has swallowed a magnet, urgent medical assistance should be sought.

On Thursday 23 August 2012 the Minister for Commerce approved an immediate interim ban on magnets of less than one centimetre in size that could be ingested by a child. This is pending a permanent ban being put in place that will apply nationally.



While a ban on magnets in children's toys has been in place for some time, this ban will relate to items used by adults that could potentially be swallowed by children. Magnets used for industrial or scientific purposes are exempt.

The ban means that small dangerous magnets must be removed from the shelves of retail stores and cannot be sold to any Australian consumers. Consumer Protection's product safety officers will be carrying out checks at WA stores and educating retailers.

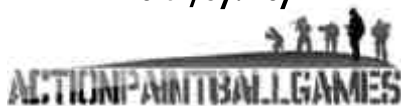
