HELP MANDURAH LIGHT THE NIGHT WITH HOPE

A small dedicated committee has been formed to organise a "light the Night" event on the Mandurah Eastern Foreshore, October 19th.

Light the Night is the Leukaemia Foundation's inspiring twilight walk to help create a brighter future where everyone with leukaemia, lymphoma and myeloma can be cured. All the funds raised from this event will go directly to blood cancer research.



All 4 ladies on the committee have been directly impacted by some form of blood cancer and 3 of them live in Waroona and 1 in Mandurah.

The organising committee of Mandurah's Light the Night Community Walk are calling on locals to let your hope shine this spring, to help cure blood cancer forever.

Light the Night is the Leukaemia Foundation's inspiring twilight walk to help create a brighter future where everyone with leukaemia, lymphoma and myeloma can be cured. This year, a group of locals have banded together to host a community event to be held on Saturday 19 October at the Eastern Foreshore in Mandurah.

"When you lose somebody special or survive blood cancer it leaves you with a very powerful urge to help find a cure. This highlights the importance of on-

going research into blood cancer treatment and the need for on-going support," said Jo Vergone, community host of Mandurah Light the Night.

Each member of the Mandurah Light the Night committee has been touched by blood cancer in some way and have banded together to host Light the Night in their local community with the aim of raising \$10,000 to help raise funds for blood cancer research.

Jo Vergone reflects on when she was first diagnosed with Lymphoma in 2011 and says, "I had never even heard of mantle cell lymphoma before the Doctor told me I had it. I could not believe that I had stage four blood cancer, as I had not even been sick, a bit tired, but with my busy lifestyle that was nothing new."

So I jumped on the roller coaster of constant visits to the Doctor, an aggressive chemotherapy treatment regime, hospital stays and blood transfusions and put the rest of my life on hold for 15 months.

The money raised will be invested in blood cancer research in leading Australian hospitals and institutes. Since 2005, the Leukaemia Foundation has invested more than \$30 million in research with guidance from an independent panel of experts.

"As a committee we have all experienced our own diagnosis or the diagnosis of a family member and so we have decided to focus our energies on positive outcomes and raising money to help find a cure for blood cancer. That is all of our motivation towards hosting this wonderful event," said Jo Vergone.

Mandurah's event will include food and entertainment as the special moment arrives – a gentle scenic walk to Light the Night.

"We want to see family and friends coming together to shine beautiful lanterns of hope; gold to remember a loved one, white to reflect on their own journey, or blue to support others. It will be beautiful," she said.

The Leukaemia Foundation is the only national charity entirely dedicated to the full blood cancer spectrum and receives no ongoing government funding.

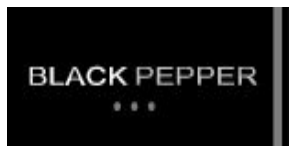

Public Notice - Changes to Post Charges

Some of you may have noticed the public notice of an impending price increase as of October 7th, 2013.

Online Purchasing

As this is a growing trend for purchasing items, and as we near the Christmas period, it is a timely reminder to those who enjoy online shopping that they should be sure they understand the 'returns' policy for any items they may not be satisfied with. There are a variety of different policies used by online sellers. Some will pay return postage, some will not. If they do not cover the cost of returning an item, return postage can sometimes be more expensive than the cost of the item, particularly international purchases! It's the same old story, buyer beware, as once a parcel is opened the postage on it expires!

Dangerous & Prohibited Goods & Packaging Post Guide - Ready For Xmas

Following up from a recent concern of a customer posting an electronic device with lithium batteries inside it, and as it is nearing the big gift buying season, we thought we would mention the packaging guide for Batteries

Wet Cell batteries (such as accumulators or car batteries) are dangerous goods class 8 - Corrosives and are therefore prohibited.

Dry Cell batteries must be:

Removed from the appliance or device

Inserted separately, if sent in the same postal article as the appliance

Packaged securely to prevent movement, so that the points cannot come into contact with each other, preventing a short circuit.

Lithium Batteries: Australia Post accepts lithium batteries and equipment containing lithium batteries for carriage BY ROAD TRANSPORT ONLY within Australia via its parcels service, provided a list of requirements are met (enquire at LPO counter for details!) concerning lithium content, appropriate packaging strength & thickness, appropriate labeling & road transport stickers. This is a guide to the requirements set out in the Code for transporting lithium batteries by road within Australia. It is the Customers responsibility to ensure that all requirements are met when placing lithium batteries in the mail.

Australia Post cannot accept lithium batteries or devices containing lithium batteries for international carriage or domestic air carriage. (The risk of ignoring this rule is that your article may be returned to you).

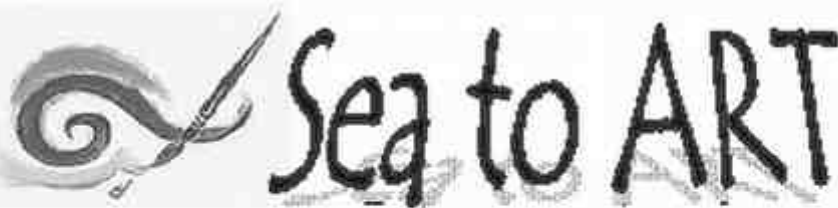

Waroona Veterinary news:

October Issues:

Waroona Show Fireworks: Please be aware that the usual firework display at the Waroona Show can be terrifying for pets. It has been common nearly in all previous years for pets to go missing and even escape and get into accidents with motor vehicles. To prevent any potential disasters make sure you have your pet secured or in a well fenced area that they cannot jump out of. If possible keep your dogs and cats inside. If you are at home with your pets supervise them during the fireworks or keep checking on them until it is over.

Snakes: Snakes are out and about, so please be vigilant to any signs of sudden weakness in your pets.

The signs of snakebite can include:-

- *Agitation or collapse
- *Sudden weakness (especially in the hind legs)
- *Sudden vomiting, urination or defecation
- *Seizures
- *Dilated pupils
- *Excessive salivation or frothing at the mouth.
- *Difficulty breathing
- *Paralysis.

These signs may initially subside (your pet looks like it is getting better) before a rapid paralysis starting from the back end of the animal develops, followed quickly by death. If your pet is rapidly becoming paralysed immediate veterinary attention should be sought.

Call your vet first so they can inform you if they can deal with your emergency or direct you elsewhere.

If your pet has definitely killed the snake, bring it with you because it allows identification of the snake as a Tiger or Dugite. This is important because animals can recover differently depending on what snake it was and it allows vets to use the most cost effective antivenin for your animal. Handle the dead snake by the tail with extreme caution (avoid the head) and do not allow children to handle the snake under any circumstances. Due to the costs of antivenin and supportive treatment, not all owners can afford to get their pet treated.

Consider pet insurance now as it can be the difference between life and death for your pet.

Bloat in Cattle: Be aware that cattle are at risk of bloat this time of year when animals are grazing lush young

pasture, particularly if it has high legume content.

Cattle with bloat may display the following signs:

- *Distended left abdomen
- *No longer grazing
- *A reluctance to move and appearing distressed (vocalising, eyes bulging)
- *Straining to urinate and defecate.
- *Rapid breathing (mouth may be open with tongue protruding)
- *Staggering. In advanced cases the animal will go down. Death is rapid at this stage. In early or mild cases cattle can be treated orally with an anti-bloat preparation. Bloat animals starting to show signs of distress will need veterinary attention. Call your veterinarian if you are concerned about bloat.

Ringworm: We are still seeing cases of ringworm in cats and dogs.

Ringworm is a fungal skin infection most often characterized by round patches of hair loss. Treatment is strongly recommended as if left untreated it allows the infection to contaminate your home and potentially spread to yourself, your family and any other visitors or pets. It can also be uncomfortable for your pet. Call us for more details if you suspect your pet has ringworm.

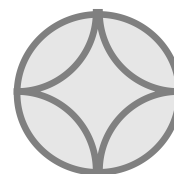

Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to animal and plant pests, diseases and weeds

Woes on the wing

Several bird species commonly kept as pets can become serious pests in Western Australia if they escape or are released from aviaries. Indian ringnecks, alexandrine parakeets, sulphur-crested cockatoos, lovebirds and Barbary doves are causes for concern as they can fast establish wild populations. Owners are required to keep them in a secure, double-door aviary, and members of the public should report "wild" sightings of unfamiliar birds to the Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) on Freecall 1800 084 881.

Not such pretty polities

Some exotic parrots beloved by bird fanciers have the most beautiful plumage, but unfortunately their behaviour once they fly the coop can be ugly. The most commonly reported aviary escapee is the Indian ringneck (*Psittacula krameri*), sometimes known as rose-ringed or African ring-necked parakeet. Its natural range includes sub-Saharan Africa, southern

Asia, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Burma and south-east China and, obviously, India. Large populations have established in Europe, the USA, Middle East, Japan and Singapore. Indian ringnecks raid grain storage facilities, damage fruit, nut and vineyard crops and occupy the nest hollows which our native parrots need. **Over the rainbow**

In the 1960s about 10 rainbow lorikeets (*Trichoglossus haematodus*) escaped or were released in Perth, where their numbers are now thought to be about 20,000. Apart from attacking orchard fruit and commercially grown grapes, rainbow lorikeets in urban areas are notorious for fouling outdoor recreational spaces with their droppings. Cars also can be made extremely messy when parked in public places where these birds gather to roost. But the most common complaint about rainbow lorikeets is the high level of noise they generate when feeding and roosting. This Australasian species, naturally

occurring on Australia's eastern and northern seaboard as well as Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, Vanuatu, New Caledonia and the Solomon Islands, is firmly established in the metropolitan area. As a result sightings in the city and suburbs need not be reported. However, outside the metropolitan area rainbow lorikeets are given high priority for recapture or removal. Please also report sightings in the Swan Valley and hills area.

Drab little stowaways

Potential pests of the winged kind are not always big, colourful characters that have left behind a cosseted life in a cage. Witness the three tree sparrows (*Passer montanus*) that turned up in Bunbury backyards a couple of months ago. Luckily people recognised these small brown and grey birds as unusual and reported them. Tree sparrows and house sparrows are declared pests in Western Australia because they can damage grain and horticultural crops, spread disease, compete for food with native birds and foul buildings through their nesting, roosting and feeding behaviour.
