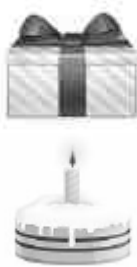

#### **Pattern for baby beanies: - reprinted by request.**

8 ply wool, 4mm needles. Cast on 72 stitches. Double rib (K2, P2) for 36 rows. On the 37<sup>th</sup> row K2 together to the end. 38<sup>th</sup> row is k., 39<sup>th</sup> row K 2 together to the end. 40<sup>th</sup> row is K, 41<sup>st</sup> row K2 together to the end. (9 stitches left) 42<sup>nd</sup> row K, 43<sup>rd</sup> row K2 together (5 stitches) Thread wool through remaining stitches, sew and secure. Continue sewing seam to finish the beanie.

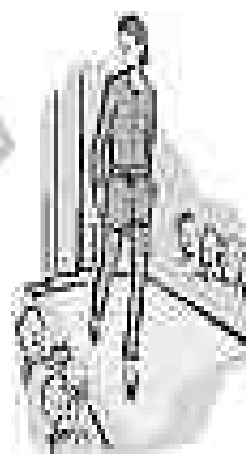

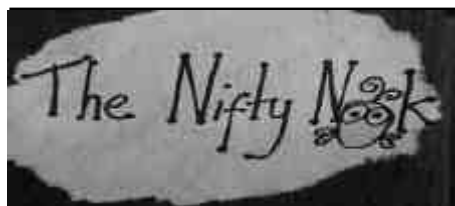
## WAROONA LIBRARY BOOK CLUB

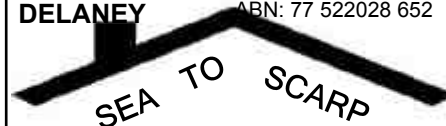

## **Waroona Historical Society**

We missed the last newsletter, so our news is a little late. Our congratulations to the organisers of the Vintage Machinery Day in September. Great weather provided a great day out to showcase what our town has to offer and what the community can do to promote the area. The Society had a display in the Memorial Hall on the day and we were asked many times how much our display items were selling for! So it goes to show that there is value in "old stuff". The old record player and records provided musical memories of an era when there was no television or digital devices. Photographs were projected on a makeshift screen and displayed on pinboards and maps of the district were available for viewing. We received a couple of enquiries which were followed up and met some new people to the district who had ancestors that had lived in the area.

Oral history recording is continuing and editing of the St Joseph's QR code project

on local landmarks has been keeping members busy.

We are now the keeper of past minutes, correspondence and photographs from the Waroona Branch of the Red Cross, which has formally closed and also items from the 1<sup>st</sup> Waroona Scout Group. These records have been placed in an archival folder and will be made available to those wishing to conduct research in the future. Also tabled at a recent meeting was a copy of the diary of Alfred McFarlane who was the first Officer in Charge of the Hamel Nursery. The diary commences in 1898 and gives a daily record of the work carried out by McFarlane and various employees in establishing the nursery and a daily record of the

weather conditions until 1900. Although not the original journal, it is still significant enough to be displayed in an archival file and from what I have read of it so far, it proves to be very interesting reading. It is now available



for anyone to browse through while at the Museum. Various photographs of the Waroona Dam and Weir have been donated along with an original locker door from the former Hamel Prison.

Past Swimming and Softball Club records have also been donated but are yet to be catalogued.

If you do have something relating to the Drakesbrook District which you would like the Historical Society to consider as a collection item, please feel free to contact one of our executive committee – Glenece, Debra or Maree. We try to have the museum open most Sundays from 10am until 12 noon.

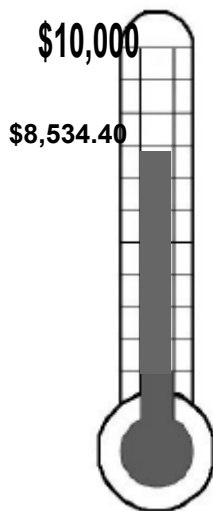

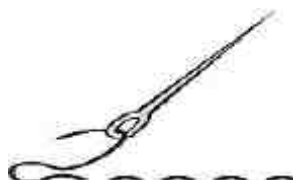

## The Lions Club of Waroona

The Lions Club of Waroona raises many thousands of dollars every year. Per head of Lions members we probably raise more money than the majority of the Clubs in our district, so where does it all go?

Every month there are many requests from Charities and other Lions Clubs for donations to particular causes and also requests from the general public for people who are struggling to survive. Every cause and request is considered carefully by all the members and after sometimes very long discussions decisions are made. Since the majority of our funds are raised in Waroona, we try to put money back into the Waroona Community as much as possible. Such things as our contribution to the Waroona District High School end of year awards are ongoing until the members decide otherwise. We also recently assisted Quambie Park in their efforts to raise funds to purchase two Regency chairs at a cost of \$6,000. To do this the Lions Club of Waroona donated \$3,000 so that one chair could be purchased immediately and then applied for an AFL grant for the other \$3,000. The AFL will match dollar for dollar that we put in. Assisting Waroona sports people to travel interstate or overseas, often representing their state and country is

another worthwhile cause. We have also assisted Waroona students in their efforts to travel overseas as a volunteer to work. When we are asked to help a particular person or group in this way we discuss it thoroughly and will often donate a trailer load of wood to raffle, so that the person is also working to raise money themselves. After all we are not a welfare group and work hard to raise the money ourselves.

With our Charity work, we also prefer to donate to WA charities, rather than those over east. However, if the Charity is a major Lions project then we usually contribute. For example a Lions International Bush Fire Appeal would be high on our agenda. Recently we donated \$1,000 to the SW Lions Clubs Appeal for St John of God Hospital in Bunbury. The reason for this was twofold. One, because it was a Major Lions Club project and two that many people from Waroona use that particular Hospital in Bunbury.

The bottom line is the Lions Club of Waroona raises money to help the Community of Waroona. We will always help worthwhile causes in Waroona, especially if they are prepared to help themselves. We are not a welfare group and cannot replace government departments.

## Jim's Kitchen

On Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> October the Lions Club of Waroona officially opened Jim's Kitchen and unveiled a dedication plaque to Jim Deleo. Lion Grant Hewett welcomed all the guests, which included: Noel Dew - the Shire President and his wife Irene, Trish Witney and John Salerian representing the councilors, Ian Curley - the Shire CEO, Sian Gair representing Community Development, Tom Busher and his wife Beth representing Alcoa, Maree Ellis, representing the Ag Society, several tradespersons and volunteers who have worked on the project and the guest of honour Lena Deleo. Grant took us back to the early years when 10 Lions squashed into the corrugated iron shed to cook the burgers and steaks to feed the hungry hordes, which the Lions of Waroona

have become renowned for at the Waroona Agricultural Show. When the shed had to be finally demolished the Lions transferred their skills to cooking in a marquee under very trying conditions. Eventually the Lions were offered the former showground beer booth as a food kiosk. This had proper sinks and a concrete floor, but we still had to cook on barbeques on the verandahs. These had to be propped up with bricks and hidden from the public by shade cloth. The project had begun. Although usable, the bar as it was, was not quite adequate as a food outlet. With the enthusiasm of a number of Lions club members, and with the financial help from Alcoa and the Shire of Waroona, and the



generous help of many local tradesmen, and the club members themselves, the kiosk has undergone extensive renovation and a complete refurbishment and is now a first class food preparation and serving facility. Two large steel hot plates were installed a week before the 2013 Waroona Show, which completed the renovation project. The kitchen boasts a number of stainless steel benches, hot and cold running water and enough

power points to run fridges, bain-maries, a hot dog copper, microwave oven, industrial toaster and food shredder, and many more instruments. All this was a long way from the couple of barbecues, a trestle or two, a handful of star pickets and a roll of shade cloth the club had used as a food outlet for a number of years at the Waroona Show. Although predominately used for the Waroona Show and other local event days, Jim's Kitchen and its facilities is available for any community group, visiting caravan club or similar group to use. Grant then handed over to Noel Dew, who paid tribute to Jim Deleo and made the official opening. Lena Deleo then emotionally unveiled the plaque, dedicating the kitchen to Jim Deleo.

Over the course of his Lions involvement, Jim had held almost every project chairman position within the club at any one time. He was awarded life membership in 2005.

I am in my ninth year as a Volunteer Ambulance Officer and I still love what I do. Unfortunately there may come a time when

there is no longer an ambulance service in the Shire of Waroona and this is why.....

The plain hard truth is that we have a core of six Volunteer Ambulance Officers who commit to doing the bulk of the callouts in Waroona. One works fly in, fly out, two work shiftwork, one works in Perth with his brother, one is from Pinjarra and will do call outs when he is able to and I work 10 – 12 hour days five days a week. We have two maybe three that will do the odd job here and there. As you can see our band of dedicated Volunteers is small but hardworking and on the verge of burning out. The pressure that all our officers are under has created a lot of tension when there can't afford to be any when we have people's lives in our hands.

Over the last ten months Pinjarra and Harvey have been called out to around half of our jobs for the year as we have not been able to provide crews. This means that the wait times compared to a crew coming from Waroona are dramatically increased putting people's lives at risk.

### Sub Centre News

I personally have been confronted down at IGA on more than one occasion and abused because people have had to wait for an ambulance to come from Pinjarra because we had no crew available. What this community seems to forget is that we are VOLUNTEERS as are the Fire Brigade and SES. People see only what they want to see and are quick to judge and voice their judgements. We as a Sub Centre have been struggling for 2-3 years as our numbers dwindle but the few that are dedicated have carried the sub centre to this point. As volunteers we do the best we can in the spare time that we have around work and families.

Those of you who know me know that I am very passionate about being a Volunteer Ambulance Officer and know that I take pride in everything I do whilst in uniform, as do my fellow Ambos. What we don't need is criticism and animosity. We need support and positive reinforcement as we travel the road to try and recruit new members. My family have lived in Waroona for 45 years and all this time the community has been renowned for sitting back and "letting other people do the work". Well Waroona if you want to save your ambulance service then it's time to get out of your comfy chairs and give something back to the community.

The members of the Sub Centre have worked tirelessly with the help of

Maree Ellis to get things moving in regards to building a new Sub Centre. After a meeting with the Assistant Regional Manager and Community Paramedic last week, it has been made clear that this will not happen in the near future. This is due to the lack of officers and insufficient funding to complete the project.

Baseline for the Sub Centre in the next 12 months is to recruit a minimum of six local volunteers and retain them after they have completed their Primary Ambulance Care Course. Continue to provide a quality emergency medical care for residents and visitors in the Shire of Waroona and surrounding communities. Ensure that our existing and prospective Volunteer Ambulance Officers receive the highest standard of training available and continued support to ensure that they deliver exceptional care.

So Waroona, it's up to you.... Ambulance service or no ambulance service....

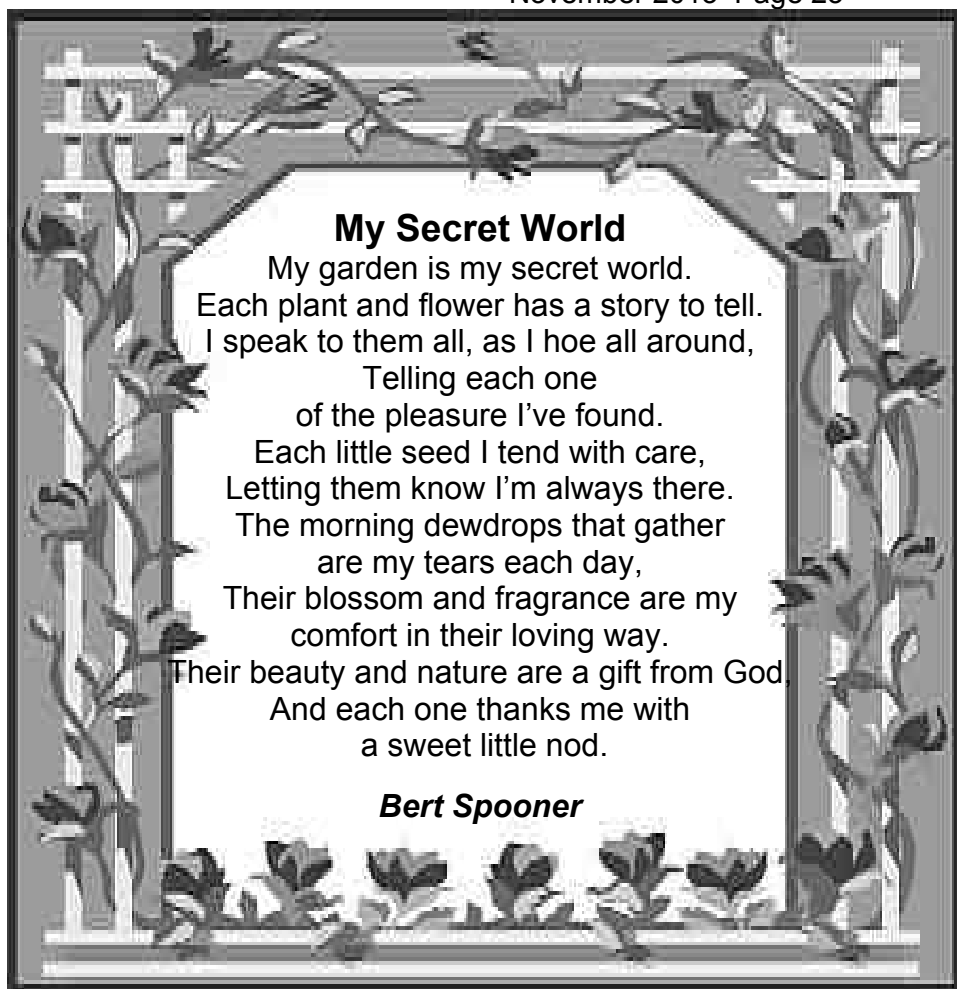

## **Waroona Veterinary news:**

### **Insect Bites**

We see a lot of pets this time of year with insect bites and stings. Pets can have reactions to stings, just as people do and they can be quite serious or even life threatening. Insects such as bees and wasps typically sting on the face, lips or forelegs. Unless you see your pet get stung, their subsequent behaviour can be a cause for concern. Signs to look out for include agitation, head shaking and rubbing of their muzzle on the ground or with their paws. The affected area can start to swell within minutes and the swelling can become severe quickly. Stings inside the mouth or back of the throat can be life threatening as swelling can close over the airway, causing your pet to have breathing difficulties. When you examine your pet if an obvious stinger is still evident carefully remove it as quickly as possible. If you suspect an insect has bitten your pet, seek veterinary treatment. Please be aware that if your pet starts to have difficulty breathing this is an emergency situation and treatment must be sought immediately. It is also important to note that minor reactions that are not treated can become a major reaction if your pet is subsequently stung at another point in time. This is due to a heightened immune response to the insects stinging venom.

### **Grass Seeds**

This time of year it is very common for us to be removing grass seeds from all kinds of weird and wonderful places on your pets. Grass seeds can lodge in ears, nostrils, under the eyelids as well as penetrating skin (especially around the paws) as well as other "sensitive" areas. They are a problem for all dogs (and cats) but especially longer haired breeds. If your pet is routinely accessing areas with long grass it is a good idea to check your pet over at least once per day (or straight after their walk) for seeds. If grass seeds are not removed they can continue to burrow their way into your pet. If they penetrate under the skin the body reacts to the foreign material and an abscess usually results. Depending on where the grass seed penetrates (chest, abdomen) these infections can become life threatening if not treated. Areas to check for seeds are ears, between toes, armpits and eyes. Check your pet for swellings, lumps, discharge or signs of infection which can indicate the presence of a seed. It is a good idea in summer to clip your long haired pets, even is it just the feet and belly to reduce the chances of your pet picking up a seed.

### **Grape Toxicity**

As all the lovely grapes are becoming available in the shops again I thought it would be worth reminding everyone that they are not suitable for pets! Grapes, raisins and sultanas can be toxic to dogs when ingested in large quantities (there are some anecdotal evidence that the same is true for cats). If your dog eats a whole box of raisins or likes to snack on grapes (on or off the vine) then your pet may develop renal (kidney) failure. The first signs of a problem are vomiting and diarrhoea which often occur within 6-12 hours of ingestion. Further symptoms include weakness, not eating, increased drinking, and abdominal pain. Acute kidney failure can develop within 48 hours of ingestion. It is not known why many dogs can ingest grapes or raisins with no problems, while others develop renal failure. It is clear though that in susceptible animals grapes pose a very real danger. If you know your pet has ingested excessive amounts of grapes you should take your pet to your veterinarian for treatment.

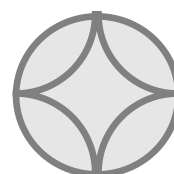

## Backyard Buddies

Your monthly guide to animal and plant pests, diseases and weeds

### **Less boring the better**

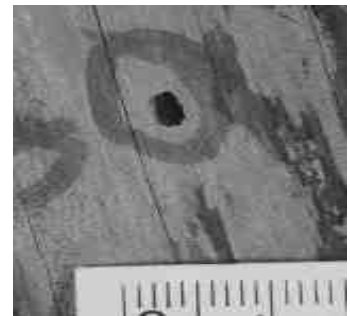
Another flight season is approaching for the European House Borer (EHB), a small black-brown beetle that spends the majority of its life cycle as a grub eating seasoned coniferous (pine) wood. As the name suggests, the pest originated from Europe and is thought to have migrated to Australia in imported pine material. EHB was first discovered in Western Australia in 2004. It is not found in green/ living pine wood, preservative treated pine or a hard wood like Jarrah. The flight season when the adult beetle emerges (it may take several years to emerge) from the wood it's been living in, mates and looks for a suitable place to lay its eggs occurs between September-April. It generally won't fly more than a few meters unless its food source has been exhausted, which can take more than 10 years. Eggs are laid in cracks and crevices on untreated seasoned pine wood during the flight season. These eggs hatch with the creamy coloured larvae boring directly into the timber. The larvae can grow up to 4cm long and live in host pinewood for 2-5 years (or longer) in WA. Almost impossible to detect EHB, these larvae will remain in the host wood until it's ready to transform into the 8-25mm adult beetle. This transformation usually occurs after 2-5 years in trees or longer in furniture and structural timber. In the larvae stage, you might hear some clicking or scraping noise as the larvae chews its way through

timber. These sounds are very hard to hear and will often go undetected or only be heard at night when background noise is reduced. Often the adult beetle is the first noticeable sign that you have an EHB infestation. When the adult beetle emerges from the wood, it leaves a small oval shaped exit hole 5-10mm in length running in line with the timber grain. Frass, a mixture of powdery wood dust and pellets of excrement can also sometimes be found below infested timber where adult beetles have emerged. The beetle only lives for one month, but the damage left by several generations of larva can cost \$1000s. Thankfully, the European House Borer program is working to contain EHB and avoid costly structural damage to buildings and furniture. Every day of the week, a surveillance team is out on the road, inspecting pine trees in the metropolitan area in search of EHB. The team has found six new infestations this year alone in dead pine trees close to previous infestations. When a new EHB infestation is located, a Restricted Movement Zone (RMZ) is created restricting the removal of untreated pine out of the zone. This regulation is in place so the pest is not spread by human movement of pine. If the pest is left to multiply and spread, the risk of structural damage by EHB in houses will over time increases dramatically. In addition to the repair cost to infested homes there is also a risk that roofs

may collapse in the future. Luckily, only two infestations of EHB in houses have been found in WA. In order to minimise the risk of an infestation, residents are encouraged to examine any seasoned pine wood including dead wood incursions on living pine trees, fallen branches and pine wood household furniture. People are advised not to collect any pine wood products or furniture from local curb side collections. Unwanted pine timber and fallen pine tree waste may be placed in green council refuse bins, council curb side green waste collection or deposited at council refuse facilities. If any suspicious exit holes are evident in untreated pine wood material, a surveillance officer from the EHB program is more than happy to examine the timber.
